Eligibility Criteria:

- Must have provided vision, value and leadership through collaboration with TX-NENA members and industry partners.
- Have achieved exceptional and sustained results with respect to collaborative efforts.

Award Recipient Receives:

- One-night hotel accommodations

Award Criteria:

The TX-NENA Executive Board will determine the recipient of the Cottingham Collaboration Award as nominated by the TX-NENA membership and as presented by the TX-NENA Nominating Committee. The Award will be presented if an appropriate nomination is made. If an appropriate nomination is not made, no award will be given.
